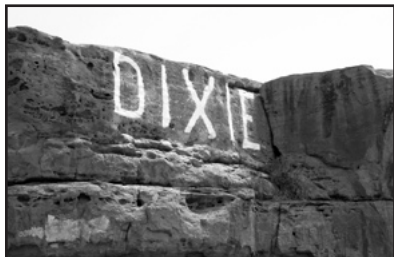

NATIVE AMERICAN STUDENT ASSOCIATION

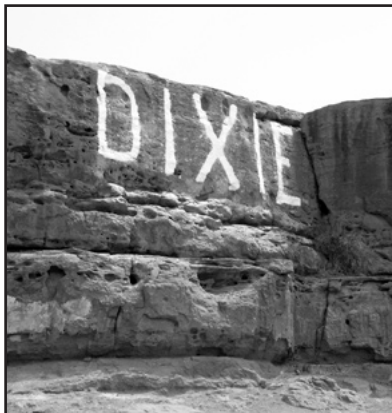
